

Criminal Justice Reform Education Series Trip to Montgomery, AL

November 17-19, 2019

This 3-day trip will provide participants an in-depth opportunity to learn about Mass Incarceration and Civil Rights. The centerpiece of the trip is a full day in Montgomery, Alabama, to explore the [Equal Justice Institute's Legacy Museum: From Enslavement to Mass Incarceration and its National Memorial for Peace and Justice](#). Participants will return prepared to support legislative advocacy initiatives in Missouri and beyond.

Day One:



Depart from St. Louis by coach bus in the early morning. Stop in Memphis, TN for lunch and to visit the [National Civil Rights Museum](#). End the day at hotel in Montgomery, AL.

Day Two:



Begin day at the [Legacy Museum: From Enslavement to Mass Incarceration](#). Meet with the staff of the [Equal Justice Institute](#), founded by [Bryan Stevenson](#), and learn about their advocacy work. Visit the [National Memorial for Peace and Justice](#), sometimes referred to as the Lynching Memorial.

Day Three:



Depart Montgomery for Birmingham, AL to visit [Kelly Ingram Park](#) and the [16th Street Baptist Church](#) and learn about the City's criminal justice initiative. Stop in Nashville, TN for a late lunch and return to St. Louis in the evening.
