

Pre-Trial Detention Criminalizes Poverty

A shocking ~80% of the people in MO local jails have not been convicted.⁶ (U.S. avg: 75%) Money and resources determine who waits in jail before trial

- The vast majority of people cannot afford the arbitrary bail set by individual courts.
- Children must be placed with relatives or in emergency foster care when a single parent is arrested and does not have the money to pay bail.
- A parent who is paying bail or other detention fees may be unable to pay for housing, healthcare, or child support.
- In Missouri, people who are arrested for misdemeanors do not qualify for public defenders. Over 90% of those who are poor and without legal representation plead guilty (they are promised "you can go home!").^{2,3} However, this assures a criminal record with all associated long term issues.
- Missouri counties can also charge people daily boarding fees.
- Some Missouri counties regularly impose fees on misdemeanor defendants for "law enforcement restitution funds."

What are the benefits if Missouri eliminates cash bail and pretrial detention for nonviolent crimes and misdemeanors and expands access to public defenders?

- People remain outside the criminal legal system until proven guilty.
- Repeat crimes are 2 times less likely.³
- People will have a chance to keep their jobs, housing, healthcare, or children.
- Individuals charged with a misdemeanor will have a right to counsel. When counsel is obtained, over half of the cases are dismissed and only 2% receive a jail sentence.^{3, 2}
- One system of justice for the poor and one for everyone else will be eliminated. "Detention before trial should be the carefully limited exception"-US Supreme Court

Where are reforms working now?

- IN 2018, CA and IL were the first states to end cash bail for non-violent crimes and misdemeanors. IL is using the "Community Release with Support" model to ensure a safe return to a court date. Simple reminders have resulted in +96% court date return.¹
- NY has eliminated both pretrial detention and cash bail. Bail bonding: \$2B/yr industry.
- KY, NM, IN, NE and NJ have all reformed or changed their cash bail system.
